Dr. Ziv Bohrer is a senior research fellow at the BESA Center and a senior lecturer at the Bar-Ilan University Faculty of Law. His main research area is Public International Law, with an emphasis on both current and historical issues relating to International Humanitarian Law (the Law of War) and International Criminal Law.
